



## **SONS OF NORWAY SELLING ITS MINNEAPOLIS HEADQUARTERS**

**“Now is the time to market our property...” says CEO  
(But, is there *more to the story?*)**

Various news sources are reporting that **Sons of Norway** is selling its 60,000 square foot building and surrounding property, and the package is being marketed by CBRE. “With all of the momentum in the Uptown area, now is the time to market our property and focus on creating an exciting new home for our employees, where we can serve the community, members and stakeholders for decades to come,” Sons of Norway CEO **Eivind Heiberg** said in a news release.

Currently, Sons of Norway houses more than 40 employees at this location on 1455 West Lake Street in Minneapolis. Hennepin County assesses the entire property at \$7.5 million, with the office building accounting for \$4 million of that total. However, the building itself actually may not be worth much, as there is a great demand for multi-family housing (apartments) in the area, and so the highest and best use of the property

may involve scraping the site and making it available for such development.

Your Navigator dispatched crack investigative reporter, **Dick Tracysen**, to Minneapolis to learn whether there was a “back story” to this public announcement. After carousing in local saloons, stopping for a classic roast beef sandwich and a beer at **Mayslack’s** in old Minneapolis “**Northeast**,” and visiting area Sons of Norway lodges to partake of Torsk, Lutefisk, gjetost and Friday night perch fries, he finally

encountered a gentleman with a Norwegian accent who claimed to have some inside information

that had been leaked to him.

“When I asked him whether there was more to the story, he asked me if I was from the New York Times,” reports Tracysen. “When I said no, that I worked for a little west coast newspaper called the Navigator that no one ever

reads, he replied that was good, because he was tired of seeing the Times get all sensitive leaked information first.

“When I asked him what was going on, he said something like, would you believe that maybe some of the Sons of Norway staff are getting a little tired of Minneapolis?” Tracysen continued his report: “I was incredulous and I asked him what he meant. He asked me if I knew that the real estate, income and sales taxes are killers in Minnesota. He noted that the only state where they are worse is California, and reminded me how crazy those people are. Wow! Then it hit me!

Tracysen asked the man about where they could possibly be moving to, and bought the man another drink, even though he was over his expense account limit. The man replied that he was sworn to secrecy. “But,” he continued, “If I was to say to you, Virginia, Georgia, FLORIDA (his emphasis), and if I said Newport, Athens, and OSLO, could you deduce anything?” After that, the guy clammed up.

This was a puzzling riddle. Finally, Tracysen went to his best source of information – Google – and discovered that there is a community called Oslo in the Vero Beach metropolitan area of – Florida! Could Sons of Norway headquarters be relocating to Florida?



Tracysen flew to Vero Beach and searched out **Od Man-Owt**, a local real estate broker who

was originally from Norway. Od told Tracysen that he was bound by a non-disclosure agreement, but he volunteered this: “I ask you, why wouldn’t they move? After all, ice and snow is so ‘Old Norway.’ Why, we have so many Scandinavians here that originally lived in Minnesota and Wisconsin. Even the Norwegians in Norway go to Greece and the south of Spain during the winter. Our Norwegian population here clearly would support their operation. And remember, we have no income tax here!

“Also, several high-end homes have been optioned in the best section of Vero Beach by some entity called ‘Norskie or nominee.’

Someone is obviously moving here from up north. There is a great piece of commercial land right on Oslo Road, just west of the Dixie Highway and US Highway 1 and not far from the Atlantic Ocean that would make a great site for a new headquarters building. Just imagine, with an address on Oslo Road, it would be kind of like the organization has come home.” Tracysen couldn’t help but roll his eyes when he heard all this.

***Oslo, Florida River Walk***



After graduating from Petersburg High School, Spencer attended Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, graduating with a degree in Chemistry. After graduating from Luther he joined the U.S. Navy and attended The University of Louisville Dental School- earning his DMD degree in Dentistry in 1946. He then served as a Naval Dentist from 1947-1949 before being Honorably Discharged. After his Navy service, Spencer and Patricia moved to Sacramento in 1950. Spencer went into private practice at that time, and continued to practice for the next 50 years, retiring in 2000. In the last 20 of those years, Spencer had the pleasure of practicing with

his son Douglas. He was an active member of St. John's Lutheran Church in Sacramento since 1951, serving in many capacities of the church's stewardship and service to the community. The St. John's community was the foundation of his life in Sacramento and reflected his compassion and commitment to serving others. He enjoyed sports of all kinds and was an avid Giants and 49ers fan. He also enjoyed playing golf. He was a founding member of Valley Hi Country Club and remained actively playing into his 90's. He is survived by his wife of 68 years, **Patricia Gedestad**, also a lodge member, and his four children Stephen, Douglas, Susan, and Dennis, as well as six grandchildren and two great grandchildren. A funeral service was held at St. John's Lutheran Church on Saturday, June 10<sup>th</sup> at 3:00. Remembrance donations can be made to St. John's Program for Real Change which funds St. John's Women's Shelter or the Sutter Health Foundation of Sacramento's Hospice program.



**Milford Pierre "Mel" Johnson** passed away this past April 24<sup>th</sup>. He was born in 1921 on a farm near Lake Emily, Minnesota and would often tell stories from his youth on the farm. 

Camp Norge is Sons of Norway's District 6 Norwegian heritage project. As a "tusen takk" for your donation, you can get the book "Hidden Heroes: World War II in Norway." These twenty eyewitness accounts were originally collected from Sons of Norway members by a District Cultural Director, Jean Bittner. We hope these accounts help you remember the acts of bravery that everyday heroes made in Norway in World War II.



Living in Norway during World War II, you never knew if the person next door was a hero; a Norwegian resistance fighter. The hero next door could be a teenager going with his dad to steal grain from a Nazi train, in order to feed refugees. It could be a girl who hid messages in her instrument case, while going by bike to a violin lesson. It could be the fisherman down the street, rowing a boat full of grenades, with a German U-boat captain sitting on the seat which was hiding them. Many Norwegians risked their lives to thwart the Nazis who were occupying their country. These are their true stories.

The bridge will soon be completed. We can get to Camp Norge again. It is time to make your reservations for the adult (18 years and over) Fall Rosemaling Seminar at Camp Norge. We will have two classes. The teachers are Karen Nelson and Onya Tolmasoff.

We will be painting a 6-1/2 x 5" card box make by Mike Lusk. Karen is teaching an Old Rogaland design on Sea Swirl (medium blue) background. Onya is teaching a Valdres Style design on a blue/gray background. Check the Camp Norge Website for pictures of both projects: [www.campnorge.org](http://www.campnorge.org). I am also attaching them to this notice.

Please make your bed reservation with me. I develop the list of who is in which room. You will pay for your bed when you arrive at Camp. It is not included in your class fee. Bring your current membership card. If you can't locate your membership card, bring the last issue of your Viking Magazine. It has your number in the address box. Members pay \$16.20 per night; guests pay \$27.00 for beds in the dorms, which includes 8% Placer County Occupancy Tax. Only members are allowed to stay in the main house and the cozy cabins. For people who want to room together, I need to receive the list of names with the first reservation. RV's are encouraged as we have a limited number of beds. Members pay \$25 per night for up to four people per RV. Guests pay \$35 per night for RV's. Camp has electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. Tents are \$15 for up to four people for members, \$20 for non members. No occupancy tax on RV's or tents. Pets are \$2 per night. Pets are not allowed in any of the buildings, pool area or sleeping rooms at any time.

Please include your full phone number, address and lodge name and number when registering. If you have e-mail, please include your e-mail address. It is so much faster and cheaper if I need to talk to you. The supply lists will be sent when I receive your registration form and check. **ABSOLUTELY NO E-MAIL RESERVATION REQUESTS.** I need the check and registration form together. Be sure to send a self addressed stamped envelope for your supply list and class confirmation information if you do not have e-mail. *I will not be sending you a supply list unless you send me a self-addressed, stamped envelope or your e-mail address with your registration form*

The cost of the seminar will be \$87 for registration which includes the class and wood piece all base coated and ready to go, hall rent, and the meals. There will be \$25 cancellation fee for any cancellations, but absolutely no cancellations after September 5th. It is difficult for people on the waiting list to take your place if they do not have at least a couple of weeks to make their plans, so please be thoughtful. Melanie Souza will again do our cooking. The cost for food for the weekend is included in the \$87 registration fee. The food includes breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. You were so very generous and cooperative with the cookies last time. I do so appreciate that. We will ask just one class to bring cookies, and will rotate those classes each time.
