NORWAY IS "REGIONALIZING"

The Storting (Norway's parliament) recently passed the most comprehensive administrative reform since 1662. Norway's 19 *fylker* (counties) are planned to be replaced by 11 *regioner* (regions) by January 2020. Four existing counties (Nordland, Rogaland, Oslo and Møre og Romsdal) will continue using the same names and borders as they had in 2017. The rest of the country will have two- and three-county groupings rolled out as *regioner* with new names. This move aims to strengthen each region and improve coordination between municipalities, regions and state.

We guess Norway knows the true meaning of local control: The entire country has a population of 5.3 million split among the 11 regioners. In the US, Los Angeles County alone has a population of 10.2 million.


