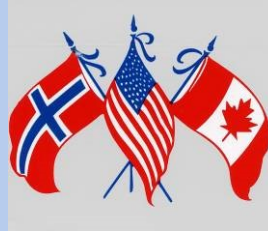


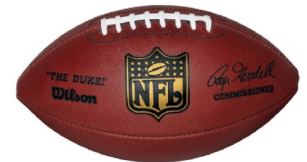

AUTUMN MEANS FOOTBALL IN AMERICA!

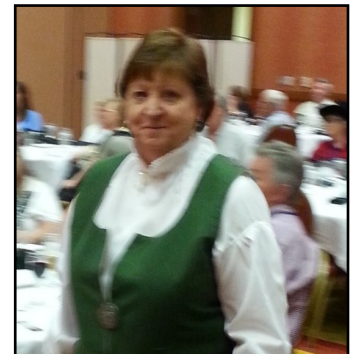

IN MEMORIAM— WILLIAM (BILL) NILSEN

Roald Amundsen Lodge has lost one of its longer and most supportive members. William Karl (Bill) Nilsen passed away on August 16th at the age of 94 – almost 95. He had been a member of the lodge for 24 years.

As of this writing we have not viewed any newspaper obituary, but we do know that there will be a memorial service at Foothills United Methodist Church, 3301 Green Valley Road, in Rescue on September 7th, beginning at 2:00 PM.

Many nouns and adjectives can be used to describe Bill, including amusing, irreverent, irascible, loud, a curmudgeon, master painter, friendly, engaging, and probably many more – all of which are positives as far as your editor is concerned. Bill was well-known in the lodge for his painting abilities. His subjects have included ships, portraits, and perhaps other objects. He often maintained a booth at the lodge Viking Festival and he obviously enjoyed chatting with all those who stopped by to admire his paintings.

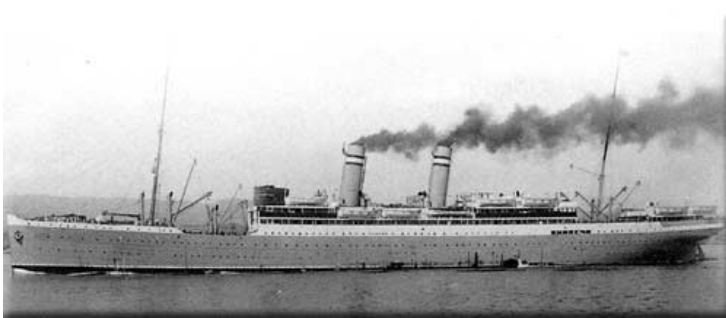
In 2005 we recounted his adventures when he left Norway just before the WWII occupation, which is a terrific story. We are reprinting it below in honor of his long and interesting life.

Bill is survived by his wife Estral and daughter Gina Feston. Our condolences to them.

BILL NILSEN'S EXCITING TALE

The photograph to the right is of none other than **William (Bill) Nilsen**, long time member of the Roald Amundsen Lodge! The photograph was taken on board the Norwegian passenger ship *D/S Bergensfjord*, en route to the United States from Norway in April, 1940. Bill was fortunate enough to have left his home in Kristiania (now Oslo) two days before the Germans occupied Norway. His pose in front of a life boat, "Noto # 23," which was picked to coordinate with the year of his birth.

A photograph of *Bergensfjord* is displayed below.



About the size of modern US Navy Cruiser (she was 10-11 tons, and about 512 feet in length), she originally was a Norwegian passenger ship. However, after Bill's voyage ended in New York, she was requisitioned by the Ministry of War Transport and converted to a troop-

ship at Halifax, Nova Scotia. By the end of the war she had carried 165,000 troops, sailed 300,000 miles, and been at sea for 919 days! After the war (February 1946) she was chartered for one voyage to carry GI brides from Europe to the US -- do you know anyone who arrived that way, readers? More interesting information about her war exploits, including an incidence of mutiny aboard, can be found at www.warsailors.com.

Lost (sort of) in America! But, back to Bill! He arrived in the United States (Brooklyn), 16 years old, by himself, and unable to speak English. For days he ate hamburgers three meals a day because all he could say in English was "hamburger and coffee!" Eventually he found a Scandinavian restaurant in Brooklyn where the waiters could speak Scandinavian languages, and he was able to broaden his diet a bit. Also, he found himself a room. After a while he found his way to the Norwegian Consulate, and they were instrumental in helping him ship out again.

Also, he struck up a friendship with another Norwegian fellow, Anton Jacobsen, originally from Bergen. This young man was five years older than Bill, and he became Bill's mentor, almost like a big brother. He took Bill under his tutelage, and advised him that, if he wanted to stay in the United States, he was going to have to learn English which, of course, Bill eventually did.

Norwegian able-bodied seaman that he was, Bill shipped out on a total of seven different vessels during this wartime era. However, one of the unfortunate results of all this wartime activity was that he lost contact with his "big brother."

Shipwrecked! One of the ships he sailed on was named the *D/S Askild*, a convoy ship, much smaller than the *Bergensfjord*. (Photo to right) The *Askild* departed St. Johns, Newfoundland, in December 1942 and, quoting from internet material, here is what happened:



"Departed St. John's on December 2-1942 for St. Lawrence in ballast, and joined a convoy that afternoon. **Ran aground** by Chance Cove (near Cape Race) the following morning, Dec. 3 at 04:20 due to worsening weather. The entire crew were called to the boatdeck, distress calls were sent out as well as flashes. They all stayed on board until she at 06:30 broke up. The seas were continuously washing in over the boatdeck where the crew was still assembled, so they were sent to the port side which was still fairly undamaged to try to get ashore. At that time two men were found to be missing, assumed knocked overboard by the seas. The rest managed to get the port boat out and by 07:30 they were all ashore, but had to climb straight up a cliff in order to get clear of the breakers.

"As day dawned, they managed to get further up with the help of lines from the lifeboat. While 1st Mate Nils Jespersen remained with 16 crew, the captain and 3 others went to look for help. En route Ordinary Seaman **William Nilsen had to be left behind due to exhaustion**, while the captain, together with Gunner Einar Rognerud and Ordinary Seaman Gunnar Pedersen reached the lighthouse on Cape Race several hours later. A report was immediately sent to St. John's, and people from the lighthouse went out to look for those who had remained behind. They soon returned carrying **William Nilsen**, while others, with the help of dogs, kept searching for the others, but came back early the next morning without having found them. A fresh search team was then sent out, from Cape Race as well as from Trepassey, and later that day the men from Trepassey

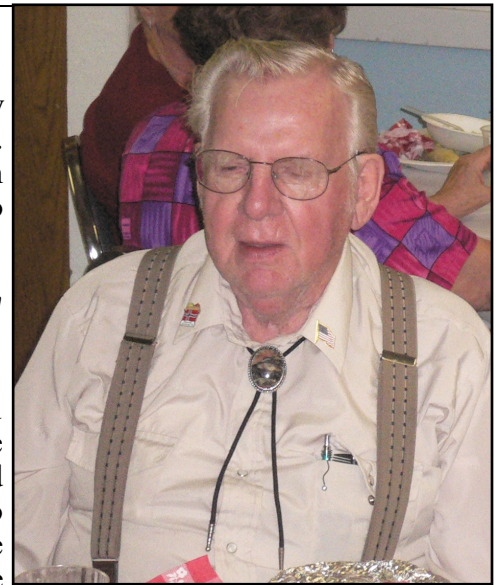
returned with Able Seaman Hans Jeppesen and the Canadian Galley Boy Walter Sheeby. Medications, food and dry clothes were sent from St. John's. On Dec. 5 the remaining 14 were finally found. They were taken to private families in Portugal Cove and Cape Race, then transported to St. John's on the 6th."

Bill says, "I still remember everything that happened that terrible night." **We are glad you made it, Bill.**

Epilogue. Bill, of course, eventually made it to California, and a good life here in the Sacramento area. His interesting experiences over the years are too numerous to cover here. However, he always wondered what happened to the kind fellow from Bergen, Anton Jacobsen, who looked after him in Brooklyn. Finally, after 32 years, Bill wrote to the Norwegian Seamen's Club in Oslo, and they had an address for him; he was living in Cedar Lake, Indiana!

Bill called him on the telephone. One of Anton's sons answered and yelled to his father, "There is a call for you from California." When he answered, Bill started talking to him in Norwegian, and the poor fellow did not know if he was "getting a call from heaven or hell!"

Bill found his friend to be just the same—just as affable—as he had been so many years before. Some stories have happy endings. *Editor's note: D/S = steamship.*

Please make your bed reservation with me. I develop the list of who is in which room. You will pay for your bed when you arrive at Camp. It is not included in your class fee. Bring your current membership card. If you can't locate your membership card, bring the last issue of your Viking Magazine. It has your number in the address box. Members pay \$16.20 per night; guests pay \$27.00 for beds in the dorms, which includes 8% Placer County Occupancy Tax. Only members are allowed to stay in the main house and the cozy cabins. For people who want to room together, I need to receive the list of names with the first reservation. RV's are encouraged as we have a limited number of beds. Members pay \$25 per night for up to four people per RV. Guests pay \$35 per night for RV's. Camp has electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. Tents are \$15 for up to four people for members, \$20 for non members. No occupancy tax on RV's or tents. Pets are \$2 per night. Pets are not allowed in any of the buildings, pool area or sleeping rooms at any time.

Please include your full phone number, address and lodge name and number when registering. If you have e-mail, please include your e-mail address. It is so much faster and cheaper if I need to talk to you. The supply lists will be sent when I receive your registration form and check. **ABSOLUTELY NO E-MAIL RESERVATION REQUESTS.** I need the check and registration form together. Be sure to send a self addressed stamped envelope for your supply list and class confirmation information if you do not have e-mail. *I will not be sending you a supply list unless you send me a self-addressed, stamped envelope or your e-mail address with your registration form*

The cost of the seminar will be \$87 for registration which includes the class and wood piece all base coated and ready to go, hall rent, and the meals. There will be \$25 cancellation fee for any cancellations, but absolutely no cancellations after Sept .1st It is difficult for people on the waiting list to take your place if they do not have at least a couple of weeks to make their plans, so please be thoughtful. Melanie Souza will again do our cooking. The cost for food for the weekend is included in the \$87 registration fee. The food includes breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. You were so very generous and cooperative with the cookies last time. I do so appreciate that. 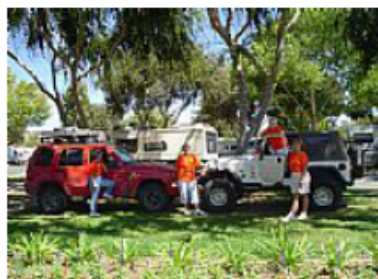
