

SOME UPDATED SECURITY MEASURES

LIV ULLMANN' S RECENT 80TH BIRTHDAY

Liv Ullmann's 80th birthday was recently observed with a fitting celebration in Oslo at the National Theatre. There were a number of people from Norwegian and international cultural and social life present, including Prime Minister **Erna Solberg** of Høyre (H). The first part of those festivities was open to the press, while a private part of the celebration continued afterwards without the media present.

The actor can look back on a 60-year career. It started at the Rogaland Theatre, where she debuted as Anne Frank in 1957. The breakthrough abroad was Jan Troell's drama film, "Emigrants" (1971). She won a Golden Globe and was nominated for the Oscar for the best female lead role.

Ullmann is also known for her long-standing collaboration with Swedish film director **Ingmar Bergman**, with whom she had a daughter, **Linn**. She

played in ten of Bergman's films between 1966 and 2003. Norway's queen of films has also hosted a series of films and theatre arrangements that have resulted in several honorary

awards, including the Peer Gynt Prize – and the Norwegian Cultural Council's honorary prize.

Ullmann was born in Tokyo, Japan, the daughter of **Erik Viggo Ullmann** (1907–1945), a Norwegian aircraft engineer who was working in Tokyo at the time, and **Janna Erbe** (née Lund; 1910–1996), also Norwegian. Her grandfather was sent to the Dachau concentration camp during the Second World War for helping Jews escape from the town where he lived in Norway; he died in the camp.

When she was two years old, the family moved to Toronto, Ontario, where her father worked at the Norwegian air force base on Toronto Island (in Lake Ontario) during World War II. The family moved to New York, where four years

later, her father died of a brain tumor, an event that affected her greatly. Her mother worked as a bookseller while raising two daughters. They eventually returned to Norway, settling in Trondheim.

She is married to an American real estate developer and lives in Florida, but travels frequently to Norway.

It is time to make reservations for the Spring Rosemaling Seminar at Camp Norge! (For Adults, 18 and older)

TEACHERS & PROJECT: Our teachers are Karen Nelson and Carl Larson. We will be painting a 10" shallow bowl. Karen is teaching a Rogaland style on an olive branch background. Carl is teaching a Gulbrandsdal style on a blackberry background. Class sizes are limited to 21 per class.

SEMINAR COST: The cost of the seminar is \$87, which includes instructions, the base-coated wood piece, hall rent, and meals. Classes fill up quickly and there is often a waiting list. If, after you have registered, you are unable to attend, please let me know as soon as you can so we can offer your spot to someone on the waiting list. Refunds will be made, minus a \$25 cancellation fee, for cancellations received before April 7. No refunds will be made after that date.

MEALS: All participants pay for meals, which include Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner; Sunday breakfast and lunch; and coffee/tea breaks. Melanie Souza will again do our cooking. Family members who are not painting can pay \$35 for meals.

COOKIES: During the coffee/tea breaks, cookies are offered. We ask that each participant in the specified class (to be noted on your confirmation) bring one dozen cookies to share. You have all been so very generous and cooperative with the cookies and it is greatly appreciated!

ROOMS: Lodging is not included in the registration fee. Please make your bed reservation with me at the time you register. You will pay for your bed when you arrive at Camp. Bring your current Sons of Norway membership card. Members pay \$16.20 per night and non-members pay \$27.00 per night, both include an 8% Placer County Occupancy Tax. For people wanting to room together, I need to receive the list of names with the first registration. Since there is a limited number of beds available, RVs and tents are encouraged. For RVs, members pay \$25 per night, non-members pay \$35 per night (limited to four people per RV). RV spots have electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. For tents, members pay \$15 per night, non-members pay \$20 per night (limited to four people per tent). There is no occupancy tax on RVs or tents. Pets are \$2 per night. Pets are not allowed in any of the buildings, pool area, or sleeping rooms at any time.

STROKE CLASS: Karen will be offering one stroke class at 6:30 p.m. on Friday. The cost of the class is \$5. You will pay her directly if you are attending.
