ATTEND FEBRUARY LODGE MEETING TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR CONVENTION DELEGATE NOMINATION






FAMILY CHRISTMAS PARTY

NORWEGIAN SCIENTISTS DISCOVER THAT EATING FISH GREATLY AIDS HEALTH

Eating Fish Early in Life Reduces Risk of Disease

It does not take much fish for young children to reap major health benefits. Fish at least once a week yields positive results. In fact, children should be introduced to fish or cod liver oil early in life, already around the age of one. These children have a significantly reduced risk of eczema, asthma and wheezing by the time they are six years old.

"We compared children who had fish at least once a week until they were two years old with children who had less fish," says associate professor **Torbjørn Øien** at the Department of Public Health and Nursing at NTNU [Norges teknisk-naturvitenskapelige universitet, or Norwegian University of Science and Technology].

All types of fish are favorable

The starting point was numbers from the pediatric allergy survey that began in Trondheim in the year 2000. Data from more than 4,000 families contributed to these new analyses that looked at the relationship between the mother's or the child's fish intake and the development of eczema, asthma and hay fever. All these conditions have increased sharply in Norway since the 1950s. They are, among other things, linked to lifestyle changes. One of these changes is that we {e.g., Norway} as a population eat less fish than previously.

"It seems that eating all types of fish provides a health benefit, not just fatty fish," says **Melanie Rae Simpson**. She is a postdoctoral fellow at the Department of Public Health and Nursing.

Eating fish has near-miraculous results for older persons, as well



In a separate study, the scientists determined that eating fish at an advanced age can not only improve health, it can actually "turn back the clock" on the aging process. In fact, several gentlemen in their late 60s and early 70s who ate fish constantly – at least two fish sandwiches a day from McDonalds – actually regressed in biological age! Over the course of two years, they became younger and younger in appearance and finally became pre-pubescent, appearing to be only 11 or 12 years old!

Now, the study will focus on whether they will live an additional 60 or 70 years from this point on. Additionally, Norwegian law may have to be changed to allow them, in 8 or 10 years, to take a frisky, comparably-aged second wife, as their current wives most certainly will be in nursing homes before these rambunctious youngsters pass their 30th birthdays for a second time.—*From Sons of Norway Newsletter Service, more or less.*

WANT A \$\$CHOLARSHIP? GET BUSY!

(Also, Information on Roald Amundsen Camper Scholarships Below)



There are various 2020 Sons of Norway educational scholarships that can be applied for, **starting now.** And "now" would be a good time to start the process, as it often takes time to secure the necessary transcripts and letters of recommendation that may be required. In fact, it is almost too late for some of the scholarships. Some of the scholarships are available to older members as well as more youthful members – check them out on the Sons of Norway website, with summary information presented in the January Navigator which can be accessed on the lodge website. About 25 scholarships are awarded each year.

Some are open to adults.

If you want to give your kids a language immersion experience this coming summer check out the **Concordia (College) Language Villages** (http://www.concordialanguagevillages.org/youth-languages) programs for the summer of 2020. These camps are located near Brainerd in beautiful north central Minnesota. In addition to Norwegian, they have camps for 14 other languages.

Also, our Sons of Norway District, District 6, offers the following scholarships: 1) Up to three \$1000 Academic Scholarships to deserving Unge Venner members attending post-secondary schools or training institutions, 2) One \$1000 scholarship to attend the Skogfjorden Language Camp at Concordia College (Minnesota; previously mentioned above) during the summer, and 3) Two 50% of tuition scholarships to attend the Camp Norge youth camps (Our own lodge usually has ample scholarships for these camps.). If you are interested in any of these scholarship opportunities go to the District website and get busy on the application process now!

Also, our own Roald Amundsen Lodge has a limited number of 2020 camper scholarships, which will pay for one-half of the camper tuition. We understand that full tuition for the camps will be \$900, and therefor each of these scholarships will be \$450.
