

NORWAY HAS AN INTERNATIONAL FILM FUND

The country of Norway sponsors a fund, The Norwegian South Film Fund (Søfund) whose overall objective is to strengthen film production in countries where film production is limited for political or economic reasons. The fund desires to help reinforce film as a cultural expression, promote diversity and artistic integrity, and strengthen freedom of speech in such countries. Also, Sørfond is to contribute to closer cooperation between the Norwegian and international film industries.

An example film the fund has partially underwritten is **Retablo***, a Peruvian film, now showing on Netflix. "High in the Andes, a teenage boy and his father work together as artisans. But their bond is shattered when the son learns of his father's secret life." The film is spoken mostly in Quechua, with English subtitles. Your editor felt that it was an exceptional production. In addition to the story that illustrates the conservative customs and beliefs of the native Quechuan culture, there is great scenery and some native Quechuan dancing.

The film has garnered many awards at film festivals. We recommend watching it before reading a lot about it on the Internet.—*Minister of Culture*

* "Retablo," strictly translated, means "alterpiece."

The word retablo means different things in different countries. In this film, the art items are like small tryptychs which open to display a religious or secular display. Think of the English/French word, "tableau." A triptych is a work of art that is divided into three sections, or three carved panels that are hinged together and can be folded shut or displayed open.

New Lodge Directory as of July 2020 LODGE DIRECTORY BEING MADE AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS WITHOUT E-MAIL



POTATO PEELS IMPROVE SHELF LIFE NATURALLY

Potato peels are not something we often stop to consider. But Professor of Biotechnology at Høgskolen i Innlandet [Innlandet University College] **Knut Olav Strætkvern** has been conducting research on potatoes for 25 years, and he believes that the peels have potential beyond composting or animal feed. "I do not cease to marvel at all the interesting things that can be derived from the potato," Strætkvern told NRK, the Norwegian Broadcasting Corporation.


The humble potato peel may soon be getting an image upgrade, thanks to Strætkvern and his team. The biotechnologists discovered a way to extract anti-oxidants from peels and use them to prolong the life of other foods, such as cooking oil, without the use of artificial stabilizers. Strætkvern hopes that this technology will provide health, economic and environmental benefits.


These methods will be tested, patented and scaled to create a business model. Knut Olav



Strætskvern says that Innlandet County alone generates around 3000 tons of potato peels annually, and that the project will also reclaim other "waste foods" to see if they can be turned into value. However, when it comes to Rutabaga waste, they say they are drawing the line.


At just 1.56, the fertility rate in Norway in 2018 was the lowest since records began. The post-war baby boom hit its height in 1961 when the fertility rate hit 1961. But after the early 1960s, the rate began to drop sharply.

The recent fall in birth rate is mirrored across Norway, and in fact there are many European countries with a lower rate right now. These include Germany, Finland, Portugal, Italy and Spain.

An interesting related stat is that the average age of a mother when giving birth is much later than it used to be. Since the 1970s, the average age has increased by around five years. The average age of a mother giving birth for the first time is 29.5 years, with 31.1 years being the overall average.

Religion in Norway is dominated by Lutheran Christianity, with 69.9% of the population belonging to the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Norway in





2018. The Catholic Church is the next largest Christian church at 3.0%. The unaffiliated make up 17.4% of the population. It is interesting to note that this is about the same percentage as in the US. Islam is followed by 3.3% of the population.

A bill passed in 2016 and effective as of 1 January 2017 created the Church of Norway as an independent legal entity. Until the 2012 constitutional amendment the Evangelical-Lutheran religion was the public religion of the State. The Church of Norway will still obtain financial support from the state of Norway, along with other religious communities.

Early Norwegians, like all of the people of Scandinavia, were adherents of Norse paganism; the Sami having a shamanistic religion. Norway was gradually Christianized by missionaries between 1000 and 1150. Before the Protestant Reformation in 1536/1537, Norwegians were part of the Catholic Church.



We would like to give you all an update of the latest news of the Camp and also let you know of the most recent happenings on the Board.

These last months have of course been very unusual times for us all. We had previously set a Camp reopen date of 7/31/20, but unfortunately, we have had to make the difficult decision to keep Camp closed until normal operations can resume next Spring. Our new target reopening date is April 1, 2021. We will revisit this decision at each Zoom Board Meeting until then, and keep you updated.

We do want to report we are using the time wisely by doing sleeping room refreshes, tree work, grounds cleanup work, and a very beautiful redo of the Social Hall with a brand-new deck.

Our finances are stable. We are balancing our income to expenses due to our revenue from our cell tower lease, rental of the apartment, donations, and careful management of our funds. With great sadness we report the unexpected passing of Susan Winje's husband David, a wonderful friend to the Camp. David provided many, many hours of volunteer time. He was a tremendous support to Susan and to us all as Board Members. He will be greatly missed.
