According to the Norwegian Prime Minister, **Ema Solberg**, Norway's borders are closed with very few exceptions. Despite falling infection numbers across the country, stricter measures are necessary, according to Ms. Solberg. Aside from Norwegian residents returning to the country, only socially critical personnel are exempt.



I talked to my brother in Norway this morning and he stated the permission situations vary somewhat depending on the county, sort of like the situation here. They just took a two hour car ride to get to another county where stores were open so my sister-in-law could buy a pair of shoes. Local grocery stores are open so at least they are not going hungry.

I was so looking forward to a trip to Norway to see my brother and sister, but I guess I have to be patient a little while longer. And talking about patience. I would like to thank all our members who have been keeping up their membership in Sons of Norway during the passed year. 
GIRL IN RED
