REMEMBERING ROY IMBSEN

Dr. Roy A. Imbsen, P.E., D. Engr., a 50+ member of Roald Amundsen Lodge, peacefully passed on Tuesday, July 13, 2021 at the age of 83.

Roy was born in Chicago on January 19, 1938. His father Nils and mother Olaug both immigrated from Norway in the 1920s. Roy received his Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from University of Illinois in 1962. Roy would continue his education at California State University, Sacramento where he earned his Master of Science in Engineering in 1972. And in 1986 Roy received his degree of Doctor of Engineering from University of California, Davis. Roy was married to his late wife, Aase, for 33 years until she passed in 1992. Aase was from Norway, and was a member of the lodge.

Roy worked as an Engineer for CalTrans from 1962 to 1976 and then went on to found Imbsen and Associates Engineering Consultants. His company performed highway and bridge design, seismic retrofitting, software development, and related engineering disciplines. He was also an Adjunct Professor at the University of California, Davis and a Research Specialist at the University of California, Berkeley.

Roy was a world recognized expert in the field of seismic bridge engineering and new bridge design. He was a key member of many federal and state agencies. He was a pioneer in developing, implementing, teaching, and applying seismic design principles to bridges since the San Fernando earthquake in 1971. Roy was a co-recipient of AASHTO's Dr. L. I. Hewes Award for the development of the first comprehensive seismic design specifications, which remained in effect for fifteen years. In addition, Roy participated in the development of the current AASHTO Division IA and the LRFD Guideline Specifications for the Seismic Design of Bridges.

Roy loved his field of work and never did fully retire. He continued working part time for several different companies and was working up through the weekend prior to his passing. Roy is survived by his two sons, Ray Imbsen and his wife Nancy of Carmichael, CA, and George Imbsen and his wife Sonya of El Dorado Hills, CA. Also surviving are four grandchildren, other family members and many friends. Funeral services were held this past Thursday, July 22 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Downtown Sacramento. Lodge members last visited with him at our recent pizza party at the Masonic Lodge. We and all who knew him have lost an accomplished friend. 



Viking magazine is often mentioned by members as a favorite benefit. Are you receiving your copy? If not, make sure you have your current address on file with the International Office in Minneapolis. To check, you can go on-

line to Sofn.com to check your personal information, or if you do not use a computer call 800/945-8851. Each week the USPS and postal services in Canada and Norway return a stack of magazines to headquarters with address problems such as “undeliverable,” “unable to forward,” “attempted – not known.”

In the U.S., Viking magazine is mailed at a *periodicals* rate. It is not forwarded like *first-class* mail, even if the member filed a change of address with the USPS. We rely on the postal services for prompt and accurate delivery service. If your address is correct in the Minneapolis data base, you may need to check with you local post office to see why the magazine is not being delivered.

REMEMBERING 1971...

In our remembering article about our late esteemed member Roy Ibsen, it is asserted that the 1971 San Fernando earthquake was the impetus for improved bridge design, retrofitting for seismic activity, and other engineering developments relating to improved earthquake standards, for which Roy and his company were integral in developing over the subsequent years. Several San Fernando elevated highway structures were destroyed in that temblor.

My late wife Celia and I lived in a second floor apartment in the northern portion of the San Fernando Valley when that earthquake occurred. I have been in earthquakes in Southern California, Northern California, and central Mexico, but the 1971 quake was by far the most severe I have experienced. I was lying half-awake in bed when the terrible sound and shaking of the earthquake hit. Our bedroom was directly over a tuck-under carport, and I was sure I was going

to end up on top of a car down below. Celia was in the living room with our two-month old first child, as the baby had been having a night of colic activity.

Once the shaking subsided to a degree, I went to the living room to check on Celia and the baby. Celia was lying curled up on the couch, completely covering and protecting our baby with her body. A snapshot in my mind I shall never forget. **-Ed.**


ly makes investments outside of Norway, is one of the most transparent such funds in the world. In 2020 the firm's equities returned 12.1% and its bonds returned 7.5%.



force in Afghanistan as part of the UN peace force. While there is a large contingent of male commandos, they are accompanied by a force of Jegertroppen (Hunter troop), an all-female force that are used to interact with afghani women. Lest you think these are powderpuff soldiers, google Jegertroppen to check out their training. Last year 200 highly athletic females applied to join, with 11 being selected.

Norway is suspending the forced return of Afghan refugees due to the deteriorating conditions in Afghanistan. Norway has historically been an immigrant friendly country with 16.8 percent of the nation's population foreign born. Sadly, it has been ten years since the anti-immigrant extremist Anders Breivik killed 77 people in a domestic terrorist rampage, the single worst mass murder since WWII. Norway is opening its borders for tourists with the caveat of proof of vaccination and a recent covid test. Vaccination numbers in Norway mimic those of the US with 60% having received one dose with 30% being fully vaccinated.

On the domestic front, if you're a political junkie you will have much to occupy you at the national, state and local level. Switch to the Olympic sports channels and take a break from our national headache. Hope to see you at our upcoming events (picnic on Aug. 14th; lodge Sunday BBQ on Sept. 12th) . Happy summer, good health, and good spirits until we meet in person.

"A GREAT UNKNOWN

Discovering the Norwegian artist Nikolai Astrup"



The above is the title of an article in the latest (July 26, 2021) issue of the *New Yorker* magazine. Astrup was a Norwegian artist and young contemporary of **Edvard Munch**. The two-page article was written by **Peter Schjeldahl**, art critic for the *New Yorker*, himself an American of Norwegian descent.

Up until he went to an Astrup exhibition at the **Clark Art Institute** in Williamstown, Massachusetts, Schjeldahl, like most Americans, had never heard of Astrup. Schjeldahl was quite enamored with Astrup's art, and provides some interesting background and history for Astrup (1880-1928), and I recommend the article. Schjeldahl asserts that despite his being little known in America, he may be more revered in Norway than is Munch.

If one googles Astrup, he will see many photographs of many of his works, and I think you will find many of them fascinating. If an exhibition of his artistry came to our area, I would go see it. – *Ed*.
