




Here we go again!

THIS NORWEGIAN COMPANY PROVIDES HANDS ON TRAINING

So there is this young Norwegian guy named **Alexander Bjørkmann.** His education was in the fields of *Mechatronics and *Cybernetic Engineering. His background includes being in the Norwegian Army where he designed automated weapons.

And then there is another Norwegian guy named **Jens A. Wilhelmsen** who specializes in finance and among other things is the Managing Director of Anchor Capital Group, based in the UK, which specializes in private equity transactions.

The Wall Street Journal reports in a major article entitled *Broadening Access to Sexual Health* that these two guys have started a company called **Sweet Tech.** Sweet

Tech manufactures a sexual tool called the Handy. It seems that Mr. Bjørkmann has put his automated weapons skills to use designing this remote controlled tool. (If you want to know more about the tool you can go to Sweet Tech's website.)



Is this all serious stuff? Well, the company's funding includes \$600,000 from the Norwegian government's **Innovation Fund.** Obviously, sex is of some interest to Norwegians. However, as far as we know, there will be no further information provided about this company at the District 6 Convention.

^{*}Mechatronics, also called mechatronics engineering, is an interdisciplinary branch of engineering that focuses on the integration of mechanical, electronic and electrical engineering systems, and also includes a combination of robotics, electronics, computer science, telecommunications, systems, control, and product engineering.

^{*}Cybernetic engineering is the branch of cybernetics concerned with applications in engineering, in fields such as control engineering and robotics.



NORWEGIANS ARE HEROES IN SPITE OF THEMSELVES
