PRESIDENT NORM'S COLUMN:


God dag, God fjerde Juli, (Good day, Happy Fourth of July)



Some of our delegates carried the stamps in their vehicles to the convention to support this project. Quite a lot of stamps were contributed.

There were 105 delegates from 46 of the lodges present. Bob Sather from the Victory Lodge was elected President, **Tove-Lise Miller** of our lodge was elected to continue as Zone One Director, and **Steve Rosenthal** of our lodge was elected Public Relations Officer.



The business meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday morning, June 4 with the national anthems of Norway, United States, and Canada, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance, not unlike many of our local lodge meetings. Connie O'Brien, Director of Fraternal Development from the home office was present to give us an update on the re-organization of



the International Sons of Norway governance, which includes rewriting the bylaws and constitution. (International President Ron Stubbings was scheduled to attend but became ill with Covid.) After 2022, delegates to the international convention will no longer be elected at District conventions, but instead will be elected only by those holding Sons of Norway financial products, and the management approach will be changed to a "Board Governance" model that is now in use by many other non-profits. It is anticipated that the board will contain some members who possess professional skills that are contributive to running an insurance company, and some of these persons may not be members of Sons of Norway. When they are finalized, the new by-laws and constitution will be available on the sofn.com website.

Also, we became aware that the company, in an effort to increase profitability, has retained additional brokers to sell

This is one of my hardest newsletters I have had to write! I received a call from my daughter-in-law Sunday morning telling me my son passed away in his sleep at the age of 47. My heart fell - how can this happen?

She also discovered that he had no life insurance. So now as an insurance agent, I am faced with what I tell my clients to avoid— not having insurance to pay for death expenses while living on a limited income.

So once again my advice is this: Please get your children insured no matter how old they are, or at least have that important talk with them. Ask them "do you have life insurance????" It's hard enough to lose a child and then to face the expenses associated with such an event. **Sons of Norway** has life insurance that will cover everyone, even those who have medical problems. **Adrienne Lincoln**



ANOTHER NORWEGIAN FLICK!

Eskil Vogt is the Oscar-nominated co-writer of "The Worst Person in the World," a long-time collaborator of Joachim Trier, and "The Innocents" is his second feature film, after 2014's "Blind," which stars Ellen Dorrit Petersen, who plays Ida and Anna's mother in "The Innocents." Like "Blind," "The Innocents" examines the darkness that creeps



up in the cracks of domestic spaces. Ida's quietly hostile jealousy toward her sister manifests in disdain and sometimes passive aggressive violence, but in Benjamin's home, fractured irreparably by abuse and neglect, darkness takes hold, and spreads to Ida, Aisha and Anna with increasing danger, resulting in bloodshed and tragedy. Great fun? Well, maybe.

Your editor watched his film "The Worst Person in the World," which was pretty good. This new film is in Norwegian with English subtitles available, and showing on Amazon Prime and probably other streaming services. Don't get it mixed up with a series production with a similar title currently playing on Netflix.
