






PRESIDENT NORM'S COLUMN:

CAROL FRANCIS IS OUT OF TOWN

Where in the world is Carol? Here is her report:

This is your Antarctic reporter, once again down on the very tip of the Antarctic peninsula. I will send a fuller report once I get home December 21st.

Early season is tougher than it used to be. Global warming has brought more snow storms making it harder for penguins to melt the snow in order to get down to their nests. It also means the team has to build a lot of snow stairs to get ashore to landings.

It is still awe-inspiring down here and guests are basically happy. We have a big bunch of Australians on board this time, and both

French and Catalan speaking groups (do not call the latter group Spanish or they bristle). We are down to about 30 German speakers this trip, most quite proficient in English, as opposed to about 70 last trip.

Hurtigruten does a good job with kids, taking them on extra tours, science boats, snow shoeing. I take them down to the tender boats before first landing; otherwise the younger staff take care of them. I get very good ratings from guests, with whom I talk a lot. Otherwise I feel a bit too old at 73 to be down here. I am easily the most experienced staff in terms of years down here (almost 21). I do inspire them to follow their dreams, and to do the polar plunge (I have a total of 20 down here). Hope the lodge has a good Julebord, and Merry Christmas to all, **Carol Francis**





LODGE MEMBERSHIP

If you are interested in joining ROALD AMUNDSEN LODGE, our officers have membership forms at most of our events. We will have forms available at the Julebord. Forms are also available on the International Lodge website (sofn.com).

MEMBERSHIP IN MORE THAN ONE LODGE

Occasionally we get asked about being a member of more than one lodge. This is possible to arrange by using the Affiliate Membership Form (#3028) available on the International Lodge website (sofn.com). The applicant becomes an "affiliate member" of the second lodge. The affiliation membership provides certain rights in the second lodge but does not include voting rights. The cost per year is \$14. The affiliate's name and membership information will not be included in the master membership list for the second lodge, and therefore the second lodge should keep track of the affiliate's information such as email address, phone number, etc.

As a practical matter, in our ROALD AMUND-SEN LODGE members of other lodges, as well as guests, are almost always welcome at our meetings and events.

OUTRIGHT TRANSFER TO A DIFFERENT LODGE

There is also a form available to initiate an outright transfer from one lodge to another. The form (Transfer Notice, Form 3) is available also on the International Lodge website.
