CATCHING UP WITH MAGNUS CARLSEN

Have you ever hit "send" too soon, only later to realize to your embarrassment that you sent the email to the wrong person? Well, something similar happened to Magnus Carlsen.

Norwegian Magnus Carlsen, now age 32, has been the World Chess Champion for a long time. Many of the champion chess games are played on-line with the chess board available to both players on their respective screens, and each player making his moves, within a certain time limit, with his mouse. Back on April 6th, Magnus was in a match with his long-time rival, the American grandmaster Hikaru Nakamura. He should



have moved his queen so as to take one of Nakamura's pawns, but he was careless with his mouse and stopped a square short, enabling Nakamura to take his queen with his king, and ultimately winning the match over Carlsen. Chess players call it a "mouse-slip."

Fast forward to now (April 19th) and Magnus is not even playing in the chess world championship tournament in Kazakhstan. Where is he? Why he's in "Vegas," playing a different game –poker! More specifically, he was playing Texas Hold'em at the Hustler Casino, and winning. Actually, he isn't new to poker; according to the Wall Street Journal he played in the Norwegian Poker Championships last year and finished 25th in a field of 1,050 contestants.

Do you suppose it is more exciting to be playing poker in Las Vegas than it is to be playing chess in Kazakhstan?



I wonder if it's true that Magnus will be teaching Texas Hold'em at the convention in Las Vegas next year...

NORWAY – RUSSIA DIPLOMATIC FRICTION CONTINUES

The Wall Street Journal recently reported (4/14) that Norway has expelled 15 Russian Embassy diplomats suspected of conducting covert intelligence activities. This will certainly strain relations between the two countries, which share a 120-mile long land border. Norway plays a crucial role in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's defense of Europe as a listening post in the north.

In addition to the land border, the two countries share a maritime boundary through the Barents Sea that separates Norway's Svalbard Archipelago from Russia's Novaya Zemlya Archipelago and extends for 945 nautical miles (1,087 statute miles). Recently the two countries' respective militaries have been scrambling aircraft to "protect" their respective sides of the boundary.

with telephone interview, a motor vehicle records (MVR) check, a Medical Information Bureau (MIB) check, and a prescription data base check.

Available face amounts are: \$25,000—\$50,000 for ages 0-59 and \$10,000—\$50,000 for ages 60-85. Premiums can be paid annually, semi-annually, or quarterly.
