## **IT'S E-Z TO JOIN SONS OF NORWAY, ROALD AMUNDSEN LODGE!**

Go to Sons of Norway website: sofn.com, and hit "join/renew" near top right of website.

You will get a drop-down message— select "join."

You will get a window to put in your zip code and then select "find a lodge."

Assuming you live anywhere close to Sacramento you will be able to elect to join the Roald Amundsen Lodge. (Individual at \$60/year; Family at same address \$95/year.)



#### **Metal Detector Jackpot**

## **THAR'S GOLD IN THEM THAR HILLS!**

After his doctor prescribed increased exercise, Erlend Bore [AIR-len BOO-reh] of Sola near Stavanger chose a metal detector as motivation to get more activity. He'd dreamt of becoming an archaeologist as a child, and within two months, he'd made a 1,500 year-old find, Norway's gold discovery of the century.

In late August 2023, Bore went to the island Rennesøy to hike and search. Having had no luck after hours, he looked around and thought, "Where would I have been, if this was a long time ago?" Near a rocky crag, the detector signal lad him to unsever semething he thought was a candy.

nal led him to uncover something he thought was a candy wrapper.

It turned out to be a huge cache of gold from the 5th century migration period. Bore's highly unusual discovery consists of nine gold pendants engraved with a horse from Norse mythology, along with ten gold beads and three gold rings.

The Cultural Heritage Act specifies that finds older than the year 1537 are considered state property, however, according to tv2.no, a finder's fee is commonly given, based on 10 percent of the current value of the metal, to be divided between the finder and the landowner.

The gold pieces are now on display at the Archaeological Museum in Stavanger.

## ROALD AMUNDSEN LODGE BUYS YACHT TO REPLACE LODGE BUILDING

Roald Amundsen Lodge sold its lodge building some years ago. Recently we were informed sort of off the record that the lodge board, in a secret meeting, has voted to return the lodge membership to the Norwegian sailing traditions of their Viking ancestors. We have now received permission to release this news.

The lodge Treasurer was able to secure a good deal on an almost new luxury vessel from the Department of Homeland Security, which reportedly confiscated the craft from a relatively small potatoes Russian oligarch

named Yuri \_\_\_ (redacted for security reasons). The lodge will be able to take possession of the ship as soon as a few letters are altered on the stern so as to change the name from **Borsht** to **Torsk**.

Now it remains for the lodge to select a Captain from its membership ranks. That person – preferably a person not subject to seasickness - will be able to take command as soon as he or she has mastered the concepts of port and starboard and the RAMifications thereof, as taught in a really short course at the California Maritime Academy in Vallejo. After paying for the ship the lodge has chosen to economize and not send the candidate to the full course, which would include additional instruction on using the ship's compass, GPS, speed commands (e.g., "All ahead full!"), the two uses of the word "knot," and to fathom a fathom. Surely the Captain will quickly learn some of these concepts utilizing the "learn by doing" methodology. Also, as Captain, this person will have the authority to perform any necessary marriages after raucous ship's parties.

**SS Torsk** will be docked in West Sacramento and will make regular trips down the Sacramento River Deep Water Ship Channel to San Francisco Bay and to the Oracle Park Ferry Landing for all Giants' games. Trips beyond the three mile limit are planned in order to offer Casino nights for the benefit of the lodge's coffers.

After so many years on land, it is indeed fulfilling to return we descendants of Vikings to our historic roots at sea. The lodge will be honored at the upcoming district convention for the most innovative approach to maintaining lodge camaraderie, financial wellbeing, and for emphasizing the Viking theme of the convention.
